WHAT DO YOU MEAN ITS NOT ABOUT CHRISTMAS?

I have childhood memories of Christmases gone by. Tree lights that were big bulbs in shapes of Christmas images like snowmen, Santa and the like. They were wired in series so that if you loosened one of them they all went out. Dad's game was to unscrew one and we had to find which one it was until we

could tighten it and they would light up again!

We had an advent calendar that came out each year and each would get a turn at opening a daily window to reveal – no not a chocolate, or mini bottle of gin or perfume, but a line of the nativity story, and the reward was to be able to read it out.

And that calendar counted down the days to Christmas Day. A period we call Advent.

Counting down the days to the birthday of Christ. The nativity story, leading to the birth itself.

But that is a relatively new idea for Advent. Since the original meaning was an observance of the **coming again** of Christ.

"The name comes from Latin adventus ('coming; arrival'), translating the <u>Greek parousia</u> from the <u>New Testament</u>, originally referring to the <u>Second Coming</u>.

The season of Advent in the Christian calendar anticipates the "coming of Christ" from three different perspectives: the physical nativity in <u>Bethlehem</u>, the reception of Christ in the heart of the believer, and the <u>eschatological</u> Second Coming." (Source: Wikipedia)

IT should not surprise us then that the well-known Carols we sing at this time actually speak more broadly of the Gospel story than just Luke's narrative of the birth of Christ we call the nativity.

Take *Hark the Herald*, which surely is just about the angelic host (?), for instance....

1 Hark! the herald angels sing, "Glory to the new born King: peace on earth, and mercy mild, God and sinners reconciled!"

Ok, so yes we see the angels meeting the shepherds in praise in Luke 2 but aren't they getting ahead of themselves a little? Peace and mild mercy breaking in certainly – but God and sinners reconciled? Already? He has just arrived. Surely he has to die for that to happen? And that's Easter.

Joyful, all ye nations, rise, join the triumph of the skies;

with th'angelic hosts proclaim, "Christ is born in Bethlehem!"

Ok, back to the nativity. An invitation for all to sing his praises (and yes he hasn't triumphed yet, the victory is not yet won – but we will let that pass). This is definitely a **Christmas** Carol!

2 Christ, by highest heaven adored, Christ, the everlasting Lord, late in time behold him come, offspring of the Virgin's womb:

Yep, so we can proclaim him Lord, even though he is a baby. That's his divine right. And still centred on Luke's miracle – the annunciation come to fruition – a virgin birth. This is definitely Christmassy!

veiled in flesh the Godhead see; hail th'incarnate Deity, pleased with us in flesh to dwell, Jesus, our Immanuel.

This is the start of the incarnation, the "word made flesh" as John would have it. "Immanuel", "God with us". This is the stuff of the Christmas story. His coming into the world. No straying here. Angels, shepherds, virgin and a baby that is God and man in one. Solid Christmas ground.

3 Hail the heaven-born Prince of Peace! Hail the Sun of Righteousness! Light and life to all he brings, risen with healing in his wings.

Wait a minute. Straying a little here perhaps? Bringing righteousness and peace – yep divine attributes certainly. Light, life and healing. Yet to come surely? Let's not get ahead of ourselves. Light perhaps – for he is the "light of the world", hence the Christingle candles last week (!) – but promises of life in abundance and eternal life yet to come. And as for healing – he's not there yet in his swaddling cloths surely?

Mild he lays his glory by,

That's more like it. He's away in a manger, no crying (perfect baby) – his glory is to come. For now, let's concentrate on his baby humanity. He is a miracle child, but just that, a child.

born that we no more may die, born to raise us from the earth, born to give us second birth. Right there it is. Eternal life (John 3:16) ("no more to die"), our resurrection to the new creation ("raise us from the earth") and life in its fullness now (John 10:10) ("give us second birth")

In a final flurry Messer's Wesley and Whitfield infuse this nativity story with the Gospel fulfilment to come. Jesus the teacher and healer, brother and friend, master and suffering servant. Who came for one purpose – to save us and all who would believe. To enable and enact the rescue of all humanity that would receive him.

Christmas cannot stand alone. It points to so much more – healing and rescue, redemption and healing. Miracles and supernatural kingdom breaking in. A destiny which means that the baby who was will come back as a mighty saviour with swords of truth and flames and riding a white horse while also filling a throne like a lamb as if slain.


As we wait and watch. Let us not just wait for the roast and the message from the King and the gatherings and the presents. Important as they are.

For the new heaven and new earth where healing will be no more for there will be no more tears or sorrow or pain or death and God will be with his people and they with their God. For eternal salvation.


ADVENT READING RECOMENDATION:
